My name is Alexia Olaizola, and in the winter of 2017, I went on exchange to Lyon, France. I studied at Université Jean Moulin III for four months.

My exchange experience was incredible. Lyon is a gorgeous city. Every time I walked across a beautiful old bridge I'd get a thrill knowing that this was my new home. Whether I was in class, reading by the river with friends or exploring the enormous Parc de la Tête d'Or, I got to soak in the sounds and smells of French life. My French improved and my desire for delicious pastries was always satisfied. I made friends with people from all around the world, from Sweden to Argentina to New Zealand. We are already planning a reunion for next summer.

I also got the chance to travel throughout Europe. I saw the tip of the Matterhorn in Switzerland and ancient mosques in Spain. I went to art museums on the countryside of France, and I saw a beautiful symphony orchestra play in a German cathedral.

Ema Asler's Travel Report: Paris in June

This summer, I was awarded the A.G. Alexander Scholarship, which gave me the opportunity to travel to Paris and conduct an independent study on museum accessibility and engagement. I spent the entire month of June in Paris, conducting research, exploring the city, visiting its various museums, and immersing myself in as much French art, language, and culture as I could. I was able to improve my French language skills while I was there, as I was practicing French every single day. Since I was able to stay in Paris for a longer period of time, I was able to

experience what it is like to live there, just as a local Parisian would.

My favourite part of the trip was being able to interview museum professionals working at the Musée d'Orsay, Musée Rodin, Musée Delacroix, and the Museum of Romantic Life. I had a list of questions that I prepared prior to visiting these museums, which included the following: 1) How can the museum afford to provide affordable rates/free entry? 2) How is the museum funded? 3) How come the museums are free for students and not for seniors (if applicable)? 4) If I am bringing someone here with sight challenges/hearing impairments/physical disabilities, do you have programming for them? 5) What methods do you employ to ensure a diverse audience in your gallery space? I also examined the individual gallery spaces, to see just how accessible they were.

Upon examining these gallery spaces and interviewing various museum staff, I realized that despite being well-established, government-funded museums, not all museums were fully accessible to individuals living with disabilities. One museum employee working at the Musée Delacroix admitted that she wished the museum was more accessible to individuals with wheelchairs, as they could only visit the gallery spaces, but didn't have any way of accessing Delacroix's gardens or backyard studio. However, at the Musée Rodin, I was told that they allowed individuals with sight challenges to feel the sculptures with their bare hands. This really inspired me, and made me realize that I would like to work in an art institution, to help ensure that everyone has an equal chance of accessing and experiencing art, no matter who they are.

Furthermore, I was able to visit the city of Versailles for an entire day, and while I was there I toured the Palace of Versailles and its beautiful gardens. The Palace of Versailles was a landmark that I had previously learned about in art history courses, and it was a site that I always dreamt of visiting. It was particularly surreal seeing the Hall of Mirrors in person, along with so many original artworks (such as Marie Antoinette's portraits that were on display in her private home), as I learned so much about these works in past art history courses.

Finally, I would like to express my gratitude towards the donors of the A.G. Alexander Scholarship, as I would not have been able to experience any of this trip without their generosity. I am extremely thankful that I was awarded this scholarship right before my graduating year, as it really set the tone for my fourth and final year at McMaster. Thank you once again for making this incredible experience possible for me. It is one that I will cherish forever.

Travel Summary

Jean Zhuo Jing Wang

From May to July 2017, I had the opportunity to work with an Australian Prevention Partnership Centre team based at Deakin University in Melbourne, Australia. This placement was part of the Queen Elizabeth Scholars program hosted by the McMaster Health Forum, which sponsors students to engage in health systems research placements in Commonwealth countries. During the placement, I was involved with a literature review examining community funding partnerships and I also had the opportunity to partake in various parts of the Prevention Tracker initiative, including meetings, workshops, and qualitative data coding. This opportunity was incredibly enriching for my learning, as I gained insights into systems thinking and chronic disease prevention research with communities. I have summarized three main things I learned at the Prevention Centre.

1. Understanding systems thinking

Previously, I felt rather daunted at the incredulous complexities of systems. While I had heard about systems thinking, this internship provided me with tools to analyze and understand systems in a functional way. I learned about workshops such as group model building, that can be used to unpack the complexities of a system and bring out the diverse perspectives on what the system looks like. I also learned about social network analysis, and its uses in understanding the connections between organizations. The perspectives I have gained from this placement will help me as I navigate complex systems in the future.

2. We need to advocate for prevention

It is difficult for prevention to take priority on the political agenda, because there are many pressing issues that are currently happening that demand attention. Its benefits are not realized until years down the road, often occurring longer than political cycles. Yet, if we invested earlier on, we would keep people healthier and lead to a greater impact than treating patients in the moment. That is why we cannot let prevention fall behind on the agenda. I believe that we need to continuously advocate for prevention, in order to prevent fires instead of constantly putting them out.

3. The Australian and Canadian healthcare systems and context

As Australia and Canada are both two well-developed, Commonwealth countries, it was interesting to observe the similarities and differences between the two countries. Both countries face similar health challenges in terms of addressing chronic disease, health inequities (especially those with aboriginal populations), etc. However, the structure of both health systems vary greatly, with more involvement of private players in the two-tiered Australian Health system. The Canadian healthcare system is largely provincially governed, with regulation and support from the federal government, whereas the Australian system involves a combination of overlapping efforts between the federal and state governments. The structures of these systems impacts the way that funding gets distributed and generates unique challenges in each of the jurisdictions.

Overall, this was a very valuable experience that taught me a great deal about health promotion research and the context of Australia's health care system.

McMaster Class of '37 Travel Scholarship in Arts and Science Report Molly Gao

My study plan consisted of an academic and practical methodology. Starting in May, I reviewed historical Chinese texts on death and Chinese culture, including selections from: *Scripture of Filiality, Liji, Mozi,* and *Guangzi*. I also conducted a literature search to learn about current knowledge on palliative care in China. I interviewed "experts" in China, including hospice social workers, nurses, and physicians to learn about their lived experiences working in palliative care in China.

Practically, I volunteered at the Ning Yang Yuan Hospice of Wuhan University. I interacted with, provided psychosocial and practice care, and observed hospice patients, their families, and staff. I consulted with families and discussed their thoughts, fears, and concerns. I travelled across the province with the hospice to visit patients in their homes, as well. I immersed myself in the hospice culture and took ethnographic field notes of what I observed.

At the hospice and by talking to experts, I aimed to explore how Chinese citizens' social and cultural values influence their views toward death and, consequently, end-of-life care. Furthermore, I examined the social and cultural implications of palliative care development for Chinese patients and their families and what the barriers are.

I used qualitative research methods (grounded theory) to transcribe interviews, write memos, and organize the data until a saturated thematic framework arose for a qualitative paper. I also wrote about my experiences on a blog about the culture and history in China. Some major themes from the notes and interviews were the following:

- Emphasis on the family. In traditional Chinese culture, the family is emphasized. Respecting elderly family members is integral to maintaining family harmony. Furthermore, some Chinese families tend to be more collectivistic (e.g. husband and wives living with their mothers and fathers) rather than individualistic. Hence, talking about end of life and making decisions around dying largely involve the family in China.
- Depending on the patient, they may have an aversion to talking about death. For some patients, having end of life conversations was a painful process. Talking about death might be seen as "taboo" in some local Chinese communities.
- Efficiency. The Ning Yang Yuan hospice sees up to 10 patients in the local community in a day. With the large population in China, this efficiency is paramount. However, at times, it seems that efficiency might override quality of care. Each patient gets limited time during visits, and the visits alternate so that one patient might only see the hospice staff twice a month.
- There are some themes that transcend culture. I currently volunteer at the Bob Kemp Hospice in Hamilton, where I provide families with emotional and practical support. Like my work at Bob Kemp, volunteering at the Ning Yang Yuan Hospice allowed me to gain personal experience with dying patients and their families. I found that similar issues of wanting to be with family, wanting to resolve existential and emotional issues, and companionship were important for all patients, regardless of a Western or Eastern hospice.

This past summer I had the privilege of accepting and utilising, the Joan Jackson Dunbar Travel Scholarship for studies abroad in continental Europe. Following the end of the McMaster Winter 2017 term I enrolled in "Shakespeare," an online course through Oxford University, to further my understanding of the early modern period, Shakespeare's writing (and contemporaries), and performance. From early May to the second week of July I studied under the tutelage of Dr. Wendy Trevor through Oxford, and just before the final paper for the course being due, which I wrote on the characterisation of 'Time' in Shakespeare's *The Winter's Tale*, I travelled to London.

While in England I was able to meet with Dr. Trevor to discuss my essay in person, stayed in the city, toured Oxford's Brasenose and Exeter campuses, utilised the extensive resources of Oxford's Bodleian library for the research component of my paper, and attended five performances of Shakespeare's dramas. At Shakespeare's Globe, I attended As You Like It, my personal favourite of his plays, and Twelfth Night, which I had a newfound appreciation for having studied it for the first time under Dr. Trevor and after meeting with Oxford's chief early modernist, Dr. Emma Smith. My stay in London allowed me to attend a performance of A Midsummer Night's Dream at The Rose. Despite seeing this particular play several times, this production still found a way to surprise me by setting 'Athens' and the forest in a carnivalesque manner which fits Midsummer's unique brand of comedy and positioning as one of Shakespeare's early festival plays.

With a day trip to Stratford on Avon I was indeed able to "brush up [my] Shakespeare," as Cole Porter would put it, by visiting his hometown, attending dual performances of *Julius Caesar* and *Antony and Cleopatra* at the Royal Shakespeare Company, and just basking in the knowledge that this is where theatre, as we know it, was born.

The highlights of my time in England are beautiful vignettes, of which my favourite was staring up at the Heavens in The Globe, knowing that thousands of actors, writers, and dreamers had stood where I was and experienced sheer magic. During this period of lightness, I noticed a hidden trapdoor amongst the celestial bodies and constellations- a door which would have been heavily used for deus ex machina in Shakespeare's festival comedies, like *As You Like It*, or perhaps for the entrance of spectres in *Hamlet* or *Macbeth*. This would never have been possible without physically visiting the Globe, and therefore, without the Joan Jackson Dunbar scholarship.

My visit to England, and studies before it, would never have been possible without the Joan Jackson Dunbar scholarship. Furthermore, this trip served as a bridge between my undergraduate degree and my Masters and PhD by introducing me to excellent academics, providing me with contacts who share my interests in North America and Continental Europe and providing me with the chance to see precisely where our modern theatre practices came from.

Thank you, again, for your kindness and for bestowing me with such an honour and an astonishing experience by way of the Joan Jackson Dunbar Travel Scholarship. I wish you all the best.

Travel Scholarship Summary Report: A Peruvian Andean Adventure

A Peruvian Andean Adventure

This summer travel scholarship is arguably one of the significant events that has strongly influenced and shaped my undergraduate career at McMaster University. In Spring 2017, I was awarded the Jennifer Dunn Travel Scholarship under the School of Geography and Earth Sciences as I wanted to pursue experiential learning in geology through a summer research internship in Peru. Working under the supervision of Dr. Carolyn Eyles and her PhD student, Rodrigo Narro Perez, they enabled me to achieve a great learning experience through challenging field work and science communication. The focus of this trip was to observe and map the various glacierized valleys in the Cordillera Blanca (CB), Peru that pose as a hazard for glacial lake outburst floods (GLOF). The threat of GLOFs is extremely serious for communities lying within the Santa River basin, a major source of water in the Peruvian Andes, due to enhanced glacial melt within these high altitude glacial valleys. In fact, from a social point of view, this is directly correlated to the effects of climate change to the people's irrigation systems, fresh water scarcity, and hydroelectric power generation. Since tropical glaciers are highly dynamic in terms of their glacial and thermal regimes, more rigorous processes occur in these sloped glaciated valleys as a result. This scholarship allowed me to start a project that specifically aims to document evidence for valley in-filling and to reconstruct the valley's paleogeography after a GLOF phenomena that occurred in 1941, which wiped out ~4000 inhabitants of the city of Huaraz, so that we could develop a study that can mitigate the severity of these effects. Ultimately, this research has significant applications to glacial sedimentology, tropical climate dynamics, and hydrogeology. In summary, during the three months we spent in Peru, our McMaster team journeyed into the Andean glacial mountains to collect field data and delivered a two-day course to INAIGEM staff and local university students. Overall, one of the biggest lessons

that I learned is that even though language barriers do exist in a trip like this (Spanish-English), nothing will come in between hard and fast science. I learned that although science can indefinitely be interpreted in many ways, in different parts of the world, and in various languages, at the end of the day, we all still work towards the same goal to accomplish the same tasks; Science comes in simply to back everything up.

During these excursions our guide taught us about the geological processes which occur to form these phenomena both in the past and present. Being there myself is not an experience I could have gained anywhere else in the world.

Once the school trip concluded, I remained in Iceland for a week to travel on my own and further immerse myself in Icelandic culture. I traveled north to visit areas much less influenced by tourism enabling me to interact and learn from many diverse individuals. One of my favourite memories from this week was meeting a young geologist who took me on a caving tour of an underground lava tube of an inactive volcano. In addition to being a magnificent sightseeing and educational experience, I genuinely enjoyed conversing with another young person studying in the same field as myself who has an entirely different perspective.

From May 2 to July 14, 2017 I completed a fourth year clinical nursing placement in the town of Fort Smith, Northwest Territories, located on the Slave River. The placement took place in the area of public health nursing at the Fort Smith Health and Social Services Authority and was a Global Health placement through the McMaster school of nursing. My goal for this placement was to develop a better understanding of the health care needs present in small, rural, Canadian communities. I was also interested in learning more about Canadian Indigenous cultures and health, specifically in a northern setting.

The learning opportunities that this placement facilitated were ones that I could not have experienced if I had remained in Hamilton. Due to the size of the community (population 2 500), there were only two public health nurses who specialized in all aspects of public health. This broad exposure to public health allowed for significant learning opportunities and partnership with other health care professions.

I lived in the local college dormitories upon arrival however was quickly able to find house sitting jobs for friends I made in the community. I was very involved in the local white water paddling club, teaching kids kayaking and stand up paddle board clinics as well as helping to organize the annual Slave River Paddlefest. I was a guide for the high school's three day canoe trip down the Slave River and also volunteered at the elementary school's culture day. I had the opportunity to learn about the local indigenous culture including story telling, bannock making, and beaver trapping from the elders.

The Clara I. Elman scholarship has allowed me to expand my understanding of health and life in northern Canada through immersion in this setting. It has enriched my university nursing experience and has helped me identify the direction I would like to take with my nursing career.

Upon arrival into Frankfurt airport I was greeted by the program coordinator in open arms, myself and other Canadian students nervous but excited to embark on this journey. We soon headed off to Hann. Münden, a classic German Dwarf (town), where we spent 4 days getting to know one another. After this mini trip we headed to Kassel to meet our host families. I was welcomed with open arms into a German family, and having never lived away from home, this was an eye opening experience. For the following 6 weeks, I attended class every morning from 9 until 12:30. 3 hours of intense German in regard to grammar, vocabulary and literature. The first week was a struggle, my host family didn't speak english and the extent of my German had just been through classes at McMaster University. Travel & Exchange Scholarship Report Name: Seana Adams

This past summer was spent at the Institute for Health Systems Research (IHSR) in Malaysia. As an intern, I was responsible for engaging in a partnership between Malaysia's Ministry of Health and McMaster's Health Forum. I was in a unique position where I was able to share information about how McMaster conducts several projects. These projects encompass evidence-informed policymaking.

Malaysia is transitioning from a lower middle-income country to a higher middle-income country. I was able to witness the challenges that accompany this position and its social implications on citizens. One of the projects that I was responsible for was developing a deliberative dialogue (DD) evaluation tool. DDs convene stakeholders and policymakers and provide a venue for deliberation about a health care burden that a particular country faces. It uses the best available evidence and stakeholder experience to deliberate about possible implementation options for a given problem. IHSR's definition varies from the Health Forum in many ways. Initially, this dissonance created challenges when trying to create a tool to evaluate the effectiveness of the DD sessions. For example, the Health Forum employs a neutral facilitator, circulates an evidence brief prior to the sessions, and enforces Chatham House Rule. On the contrary, IHSR does not have facilitators, and if they do, it is someone in a biased position (such as the Director General). The dialogues run by IHSR are also more conference-like, with a unilateral exchange of information rather than a deliberation amongst all present parties.

The evaluation tool that myself and two other students created was fielded at a DD pertaining to JOM MAMA. JOM MAMA is an initiative that targets young families and pregnant women with the hope of reducing the high obesity and diabetes rates in the country. Mothers are educated on healthy diets and physical activities, and expecting families are offered an application on a device that contains all the relevant health information. This initiative is interesting because it targets a population that can evoke the most change for subsequent generations. The goal of the tool was to ensure that research sharing sessions, such as JOM MAMA, are more effective. In turn, this would increase the amount of research that is translated into practice and policy.

After analyzing the results from the tool that we created, responses suggested various avenues for improvement. The results suggested that these sessions could be improved by: inviting a more diverse range of stakeholders, employing Chatham House Rule, and circulating an evidence brief prior to the session. First, a diverse range of stakeholders would ensure that their relevant experiences contribute to the the implementation of the proposed policy. Second, Chatham House Rule would ensure that participants feel safe sharing their own opinions. Lastly, a pre-circulated evidence brief would ensure that all participants have the same baseline information prior to the commencement of the deliberation. This would improve the quality of the discussion.

The development of a DD tool has been an amazing experience that has shed light on the importance that research sharing has on policy development and ultimately, target populations. I am excited to see the development of policy within the JOM MAMA initiative positively impact populations at risk of obesity and diabetes. This summer, I've enhanced my communication skills, leadership skills, and problem solving abilities. This was an amazing learning experience and I am extremely grateful for having had the opportunity to grow personally and professionally these past three months.

T. Russell Wilkins Memorial Travel Scholarship Report

In March of 2017, I was exceptionally fortunate to receive the T. Russell Wilkins Memorial Travel Scholarship. I embarked on a Nursing and Healthcare Delegation offered through the International Scholar Laureate Program, an honours society whom I was connected with through my membership in the Golden Key Society at McMaster. Our delegation travelled throughout Australia's east coast, visiting the cities of Sydney and Brisbane, as well as Cairns; Australia's tropical north.

I was privileged enough to represent Canada amongst 80 other nursing and healthcare students and professionals. I was able to bring with me my experiences of being a developing professional in a healthcare system similar to Australia. As part of our delegation curriculum, we received a lecture from a member of the Nursing Board of Australia, giving us a comprehensive look at their universal healthcare program. In looking at their healthcare model, we were also introduced to the challenges that the system currently faces. The country experiences a nursing shortage, specifically in the areas of geriatrics, mental health, and midwifery. What results are high nurse-client ratios, and large amounts of unregulated healthcare providers being responsible for patient care. Strategies are currently being employed to develop nurses in these areas.

Midwifery was a strong focus of the delegation's curriculum as the position plays a vital role in the country's perinatal care. Our group had a site visit to the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital in Sydney to have a lecture on the role of the midwife in care, and the environments in which a midwife can work. We were then taken into the hospital to visit the delivery unit, the birthing unit, and the antenatal and postnatal care floors. It was so interesting to see the set up used in the units and individual rooms, and the level of care they are capable of providing to their clients, both maternal and neonatal.

The second major focus of the delegation was the care of Australia's large indigenous population. Our group was given a presentation by a member of the Wiradjuri tribe, the largest in New South Wales. They spoke about their way of life, and how they view themselves as being one with the land. He shared the difficulties in accessing health care from the tribe's perspective, which ultimately stem from cultural misunderstanding and pressure to adopt a 'medicalized' model of health. Another major component of their challenges with Australia's universal healthcare is accessibility. Most of the indigenous tribes within Australia are settled in the Australian Outback, hours from the nearest tertiary facility. In order to address the remoteness of many indigenous individuals, Australia uses the Royal Flying Doctor Service, a form of aeromedical nursing, responding to emergencies in remote areas of the country. The intention of this service is to reach these individuals faster than would be possible by land, and to provide care for them while transporting them to a tertiary medical facility (usually Brisbane), potentially hundreds of kilometers away.

I see this trip as an exceptional privilege and learning experience, but it also represents a pivotal moment for me in realizing my desire to make health care universally accessible. The knowledge and perspectives I gained through this delegation will help inform my future educational and career endeavours. I am exceptionally grateful for this scholarship in supporting my travelling and interests in enhancing health care on the global scale.

RE: Undergraduate Council Ad Hoc Committee on Deferred Exams

At its meeting on March 27, 2018, Undergraduate Council approved a motion to prioritize the creation of an Ad Hoc Committee on Deferred Examinations.

JASC proposed prioritizing the Ad Hoc Committee on Deferred Examinations because this impacts a broader number of students and is widely supported by the Faculty Offices and incoming McMaster Student Union leaders. The University Secretariat has developed the terms of reference and membership for an Ad Hoc Committee on Deferred Examinations for approval.

The M2M Ad Hoc Committee, as well as committees on non-McMaster credentials and three-year degrees, will remain on the work plan and be revisited upon conclusion of the deferred examinations work.

Motion:

That Undergraduate Council approve the creation of an Ad Hoc Committee on Deferred Examinations, to undertake its work over the 2018-19 year, and make recommendations to Undergraduate Council no later than April 30, 2019.

Deferred Examinations Background

Undergraduate Council Ad Hoc Committee on Academic Structures for Student Success (CASS) is looking to strike an Ad Hoc Committee to review deferred exams.

RECOMMENDATION: Undergraduate Council strike an ad hoc committee to review the deferred examination process, specifically to:

- Discuss the difference between accommodations and relief granted through petitions
- Review the impacts on both the students and the University from the:
 - o number of deferred examinations
 - o number of students who are granted but do not sit for the deferred examination
 - number of students who retroactively drop the course after being granted a deferred examination
 - number of students who submit a petition to request a deferred examination after becoming sick at the original examination
- Review the pass/fail rate of deferred examinations
- Review the length of time between the final examination and the deferred examination and discuss
 what is appropriate
- Review how often the deferred examination is different from the original examination and suggest
 guidelines which address academic integrity, equity issues between different versions of exams, etc.
- Recommend changes to the deferred examination process which fosters student success and academic integrity

Deferred Examinations

Accommodations are given on the basis of disability, religion, family status or other human rights related grounds and for which the University is legally obligated to provide accommodations. Accommodations are distinct from relief, which is given based on the consequences of missed term work or examinations when there are compelling personal, family or medical circumstance; relief is sought through a petition process and the University is under no obligation to grant it. This can be quite confusing, however, because accommodations and relief are often used interchangeably and become entangled in the minds of students and others. For example, a student with a disability (who needs an accommodation) may be granted a deferred examination (which is a form of relief). To make matters more confusing, medical documentation can be required to be submitted through both processes. Despite the confusion, it is important to understand and maintain the distinction between the two.

Students are expected to be available to write examinations during the exam period. Occasionally, students are unable to do so and they can submit a petition to write a deferred examination. It is important to note a deferred examination is a form of relief granted following a petition; it is not an accommodation. The deferred exam process has been in place at McMaster for decades and, while the number of deferred examinations granted is significant, it represents a small portion of the regularly scheduled examinations. For example, 81,589 examinations were written in April 2017 with 1,224 deferred examinations in June 2017. Faculty members, Associate Deans and Assistant Deans have expressed concern about the length of time between the regular examination period and the deferred examination period, which is several weeks, and the likelihood that the delay is not conducive to student success. How the deferred examination process functions has not be reviewed in recent memory.

Policy Considerations

Please note: the language is directly taken from the 2018-19 Undergraduate Calendar - General Academic Regulations

Examinations

The Office of the Registrar will reschedule final examinations within the examination period for the reasons listed below. Application to reschedule examinations must be made at least 10 working days before the scheduled examination period. Failure to meet the stated deadline may result in the denial of the application.

- · Conflict with religious obligations
- · More than one examination scheduled at the same time
- Three examinations in one calendar day (midnight to midnight).
- Three consecutive examinations over two days (e.g., December 14th at 4:00 pm and 7:30 pm and December 15th at 9:00 am).

Students who miss a final examination for medical or personal reasons may submit a <u>Petition for Special Consideration: Request for Deferred Examination (Form B)</u> to their Faculty/Program Office, normally within five working days of the missed examination.

Students who begin a final examination, but are unable to complete it for medical reasons, may submit a <u>Petition for Special Consideration (Form A)</u> to their <u>Faculty/Program Office</u>, normally within five working days of the examination.

Students with disabilities are required to inform <u>Student Accessibility Services</u> of accommodation needs for examinations on or before the last date for withdrawal from a course without failure by default. This allows sufficient time to verify and arrange appropriate accommodation.

Petition for Special Consideration

The Petition for Special Consideration: Request for Deferred Examination (Form B) is used when a student misses an examination because of compelling medical or personal reasons.

- 1. Once a student has completed an examination, no special consideration will be granted.
- A student who misses an examination because of compelling medical or personal reasons may submit a
 Petition for Special Consideration: Request for Deferred Examination (Form B) to the <u>Faculty/Program</u>
 Office, normally within five working days of the missed examination.
- 3. If the reason is medical, the approved McMaster University Medical Form must be used. The student must be seen by a doctor at the earliest possible date, normally on or before the date of the missed exam and the doctor must verify the duration of the illness. Relief will not be available for minor illnesses. If the reason is non-medical, appropriate documentation with verifiable origin covering the relevant dates must be submitted, normally within five working days.
- 4. In deciding whether or not to grant a petition, the adequacy of the supporting documentation, including the timing in relation to the due date of the missed work and the degree of the student's incapacitation, will be taken into account.
- 5. It is the student's responsibility to check Mosaic Student Center > Deferred Exam Approvals or with the <u>Faculty/Program Office</u> for a decision on the request for a deferred examination. If the deferred examination is granted, the student will be informed officially by means of the notation <u>DEF</u> which will appear against the relevant course on the student's academic record and via Mosaic > Student Center > View My Grades.
- 6. Deferred examinations are written during the next official University <u>deferred examination period</u>. Default of the deferred examination will result in a fail for that examination.
- Students who have been granted more than one deferred examination may be required by their Faculty/Program Office to reduce their course load during the term in which the deferred examinations are

- being written. The decision on a reduced load will be made and communicated with the decision on the request for deferred examinations.
- 8. At the discretion of the <u>Faculty/Program Office</u>, students who have been granted one or more deferred examinations, may not be allowed to enrol in a subsequent term until all deferred examinations have been completed and the Academic Standing calculated. Students will be notified of this decision by their Faculty/Program Office.
- 9. Students who will be living more than 160 kilometres from Hamilton during the deferred examination period and wish to write their approved deferred examination at an institution other than McMaster must submit a Request to Write Deferred Examination Off-campus Form at least 15 working days prior to the deferred examination period. Students are responsible for making arrangements for a presider to conduct the deferred examination at an outside institution and for paying any fees such as invigilation and return courier.
- 10. The authority to grant any petitions lies with the <u>Faculty/Program Office</u> and is discretionary. It is imperative that students make every effort to meet the originally-scheduled course requirements and it is a student's responsibility to write examinations as scheduled.

Decisions made on Petitions for Special Consideration are final. In accordance with the <u>Student Appeal Procedures</u>, decisions made on Petitions for Special Consideration cannot be appealed to the Senate Board for Student Appeals. However, should students believe a decision violates their human rights, they may wish to consult McMaster's <u>Policy on Discrimination and Harassment: Prevention & Response</u> and visit one of the four intake offices (<u>Equity and Inclusion Office</u>, <u>Student Support & Case Management</u>, <u>Employee/Labour Relations</u>, <u>Professionalism Office in Faculty of Health Sciences</u>) to initiate a complaint.
