The Adella Margaret Bragg Scholarship

The Joan Jackson Dunbar Travel Scholarship Report

It was an honour to receive the Joan Jackson Dunbar Travel Scholarship, and the experience that it afforded me was exceptional. Funded by this scholarship, I attended the University of Cambridge for their International Summer Programme. While at Cambridge, I learned so much through my courses, as well as the city and the programme as a whole. I stayed in Queen's College which is located in a central and historic area, and this allowed me to see much of what the city had to offer. The city of Cambridge is steeped in history, and I visited numerous colleges, churches, and buildings that have played a role in both English and global society throughout time. With events such as the Shakespeare Festival taking place while I was there, I was able to get to know the culture of the city as well. As students from the programme attended performances of Shakespeare plays, the texts that I so often read in my classes at McMaster were brought to life. As well, there was immense variety in the lectures that I was able to take part in; ranging from discussions of Macbeth or the nature of the English language to cognitive disorders and neurobiology. Writing an essay for one of my courses, to be evaluated by the professor, was also a great experience and an excellent opportunity for me to really engage with the material. Learning and socializing with people of so many different backgrounds taught me things about other nations and cultures that I otherwise would not have known. Seinan Gakuin University,
Fukuoka, Japan

I spent my exchange at Seinan Gakuin University in Fukuoka Japan. Fukuoka is on the southern island of Kyushu in Japan. I really enjoyed my stay at the university. The classes I took were very interesting and allowed me to learn thing I wouldn't be able to experience in Canada. Classes were generally quite small, under 20 people and were an hour and a half long. Most classes were run in a lecture style. In those classes the professor would lecture and occasionally ask questions to raise a discussion. These discussions were interesting because you got to hear different opinions from all around the world, as the classes were attended by other international students.

During my time at Seinan I stayed at the On-Campus dormitory, I-House. My room was a little tiny, but I enjoyed it. My room had a bed, desk, mini fridge, toilet and sink and a balcony. There was a communal kitchen with a large fridge and freezer, a stove, microwave, and rice cooker. The showers were communal as well. Most of the international student choose to stay here as it was very close to campus and one of the cheaper accommodation options. This was nice because it allowed all the international students to get to know each other very quickly.

There were lots of clubs available to join. They were athletic and cultural clubs. However, the semesters for the Japanese students and the international students didn't align, if you wanted to join a club, you would be joining in the middle of the Japanese semester. It was also a little difficult to join a club if the members did not speak English. However, club members tried their best to make you feel welcome, even if there was a language barrier.

There are some bars and restaurants in Nishijin, the area where the university is located. However, there is a lot more things to do in Tenjin, which is where I spent a lot of my free time. There were 2 subway stations near the campus. It took around 15 minutes to get to Tenjin, Fukuoka's shopping district by subway. There are a wide variety of bars, clubs, karaoke bars, and arcades open late. There was also an underground shopping center that had a wide variety of stores.

During my stay, I was given the opportunity to visit a local high school. This was an interesting experience because I was able to learn a lot about Japanese culture. The students took us around the school and let us experience Japanese culture, like a tea ceremony, wearing kimono, and calligraphy. We also watched a kendo and Japanese archery practice. At the end, we made lunch with the Japanese students and ate together. This was a very enriching experience as it allowed me to enjoy experiences that I may have not been able to experience during my regular day-to-day life. I was also able to learn about Japanese youth culture because they students led the tour.

Overall, I had a fantastic experience at Seinan Gakuin and in Japan. I would gladly do it again if given the opportunity. I was able to learn so much about a culture and language different to my own. I was also able to make friends from all over the world, not just Japan.

Russel T. Wilkins Travel Scholarship Recipient Report: Bolade (Ajarat) Shipeolu

This past summer was unquestionably one of my most memorable. I had the tremendous opportunity to embark on a research placement at the Institute for Health Systems Research (IHSR) in Malaysia where was immersed in health policy-related work. I collaborated with fellow students and colleagues at IHSR by providing research support to facilitate evidence-informed decision-making and improvements to IHSR's priority projects. My first day was April 30, 2018, and the last, which came too quickly was July 30, 2018. The internship saw me in three separate departments: Quality Assurance, Health Research Outcomes, and Health Policy.

Foremost, I was involved in a project that directly supported IHSR's goal to improve oral health among Malaysian schoolchildren. This required searching and critically appraising the literature, exploring relevant initiatives employed in comparable nations, and assessing the applicability of the research evidence in the Malaysian context. These findings were presented in the form of a rapid review. Interestingly, I was able to develop my competencies in writing rapid reviews through this project as it was my first time creating one. As well, a fellow student and I compiled sources that we consulted in drafting this review into a resource folder and presentation for our Malaysian colleagues who were eager to learn about the process.

Another project aimed to assess the input of primary health care (PHC) service delivery and subsequently the performance of the PHC delivery system in Malaysia. This project involved researching markers of PHC performance within countries that are part of the ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations) intergovernmental organization. This research was presented to our colleagues in the form of a presentation complemented by a more comprehensive report. I was fortunate to travel to some of these countries. On top of exploring a new landscape and engaging with the culture, these trips were particularly fascinating for me because I was able to relate some of my experiences in said country to elements of my research, an experience which would have been impossible without funds from this scholarship.

Furthermore, community excursions broadened my perspective by allowing me to witness onthe-ground realities of the work being done at the office. For example, partaking in home visits during the pre-test of a questionnaire assessing healthcare demand allowed me to observe provider-patient and researcher-patient interactions. Partaking in a stakeholder discussion regarding improvements to the same questionnaire was also an important experience because the professionals came from different backgrounds and for that reason, had competing priorities and made significant inputs. I was able to contrast concerns that were brought up by professionals and by patients regarding the questionnaire, which emphasized the importance of consulting relevant parties before implementing health-related initiatives. While this is often mentioned in literature, experiencing this brought a whole new meaning.

Overall, my time in Malaysia affirmed to me that thrusting myself into unfamiliar spaces is stimulating and fuels my enthusiasm to learn. Thanks to support from this generous scholarship, I was able to take part in what was such a transformative undertaking for me. Contributing to health matters on an institutional level cemented my interest in translational research on a global scale. I was also left feeling fulfilled, having built strong connections with incredible people in what used to be an unfamiliar place. That said, I look forward to seeking opportunities that encourage such meaningful travel and learning experiences and encouraging that of my peers.

Dear Nancy Solano,

I was honoured to receive a Travel and Exchange scholarship for completing the Intensive French program in Quebec City at the University of Laval. My experience began on May 13th and finished on June 16th. Here is the brief summary of my experience.

I was living in the residence at the University of Laval for 5 weeks. I was taking three courses: phonetics, oral comprehension and grammar. Classes were every day from 8:30 am to 11:50 am. My group consisted of 18 people. Our typical class time included listening to French conversations audios, working in the team of 2-3 people and answering questions. We had homework every day to practice new topics. Additionally, at the end of each week, we gave a presentation on a given topic or completed a grammar test. Along with that, we had laboratory work, which consisted of computer classes where we recorded ourselves and practiced our pronunciation.

Furthermore, this program included different workshops in the afternoon. My workshop was theatre. It was hosted once per week during which we were able to put a show for other students in the language school that was performed during the last week of classes. Along with theatre, there was a conversation class, where we were learning new words and daily life phrases in the province of Quebec. Furthermore, we were doing different activities in the afternoon. This includes yoga classes, excursions to the Quebec City and boarding games. Every Saturday we were going outside of the town, doing hiking or visiting other cities. My Saturday trips included hiking in Park of Jacques-Cartier, Stoneham and trip to the city of Levis.

Overall, it was a great experience and I really improved my French, by completing the Intensive French program of level 5 out of 6.

Required Courses

Principles of Suretyship

A suretyship is a three-party agreement in which a guarantor assumes responsibility for the defaults or debts of one of the other two parties. They're especially common in construction projects of all sizes. In this course you'll learn about surety bonds and the suretyship process in all its intricacy and detail.

Pre-requisite: N/A

Contract Surety

Contract surety bonds are a vital part of the construction industry. In this course, you'll learn how they provide assurance and financial security for projects and guarantee that a contractor is qualified to oversee all work and related payrolls - and what to do in case of default. You'll learn standard construction procedures and the nature of contract surety.

Pre-requisite: Principles of Suretyship

Construction & Surety Law

No matter how meticulously you plan a construction project, legal disputes can arise. This course explores the basic principles of contract law as they apply to construction. Learn how contract law surrounding construction sureties evolved in Canada - the common law provinces and Quebec - and how to analyze contract documents. You'll also learn about tendering and construction liens.

Pre-requisite: Principles of Suretyship

ACC 925 Introductory Financial Accounting

Examine generally accepted accounting principles, the transaction cycle, financial statements and the balance sheet. Recommended prerequisite: ACC 830 or equivalent.

Elective Courses

ACC 920 Effective Communication

Develop critical thinking, research, writing, editing, and presentation skills. Learn strategies for writing effective business summaries and reports. Explore the tools and techniques for successfully preparing for and writing examinations.

Antirequisite: BUS 850 Business Communications

BUS 850 Business Communications

Gain the knowledge and skills associated with clearly receiving, transmitting and communicating information within the business environment.

Antirequisite: ACC 920 Effective Communication

BUS 436 Business Law

Gain insight on legal topics that accountants and general business managers encounter to recognize where legal problems exist and what avenues are open to resolve them.

BUS 825 Business Foundations

Study business in a Canadian context, including finance, personnel, marketing, operations and general management.

ACC 818 Economics

Understand economics, including the basic principles of microeconomics and macroeconomics. Some knowledge of graphs and equations is required. *ACC 829 - Preparatory Mathematics is recommended as a pre-requisite to this course.

HRM 821 Organizational Behaviour

Explore human behaviour through influences that affect productivity, efficiency and organizational effectiveness through group work and case material.

MKT 819 Introduction to Marketing

Learn basic marketing concepts, including product development, market segments, pricing strategies, brand equity, distribution channels and promotional activities.

ACC 928 Introductory Management Accounting

Study managerial and cost accounting issues as a framework for approaching contemporary cost problems.

ACC 926 Intermediate Financial Accounting I

Study the reporting environment, accounting process and asset valuation issues. Special topics include accounting for changes, errors and prior period adjustments.

Prerequisite: Introductory Financial Accounting or equivalent

ACC 927 Intermediate Financial Accounting II

Examine current financial reporting requirements and practices for liabilities and shareholders' equity, concentrating on the theoretical application and highlighting of other regulatory requirements.

Prerequisite: Intermediate Financial Accounting I or equivalent

ACC 929 Intermediate Management Accounting

Build on the concepts of cost accumulation and allocation. Examine cost-volume-profit analysis and capital budgeting.

Prerequisite: Introductory Financial Accounting + Introductory Management Accounting or equivalent

ACC 934 Advanced Financial Accounting

This course deals with more advanced topics in financial accounting and reporting with an emphasis on business combinations and foreign currency transactions and translation. Accounting for non-profit sector organizations will also be examined with emphasis on financial reporting issues and objectives, financial statement disclosures and fund accounting.

Prerequisite: Intermediate Financial Accounting I or equivalent

ACC 930 Advanced Management Accounting

Building on models presented in Intermediate Management Accounting, study how systems and information are structured for managerial planning, decision making and evaluation. Prerequisite: Introductory Financial Accounting + Intermediate Management Accounting or equivalent

ACC 933 Financial Management

Study asset and equity management with a focus on working capital levels, capital structure and distribution of profits.

Prerequisite: Intermediate Financial Accounting II + Intermediate Management Accounting or equivalent

ACC 937 Taxation I

Examine the theory and application of the Income Tax Act as it relates to both individuals and corporations.

Prerequisite: Intermediate Financial Accounting II or equivalent

RSK 713 Risk Management Principles & Practices

Study the first two steps of the risk management decision making process: (1) identifying and analyzing the loss exposures, and (2) developing alternative techniques for treating each exposure. Learn to choose the best risk management alternative and select the most appropriate techniques for handling each exposure.

RSK 714 Risk Assessment & Treatment

Explore the selection, implementation and monitoring of risk control techniques that are essential in preventing or minimizing potential losses before they occur. Examine fault-free study, statistical analysis, contractual liability reviews and in-house safety programs. Study the two dimensions of loss, frequency and severity, with particular attention on losses to property, people, net income and liability.

RSK 715 Risk Financing

Examine the selection, implementation and monitoring of risk financing techniques, which are ways an organization can obtain funds to pay for any accidental losses that occur. Study the framework and criteria for risk financing techniques; financing property, net income, liability and personnel losses; accounting and some income tax aspects of accidental losses; implementing risk retention, including use of affiliated assurers; insurance pricing; selection of insurers and their representatives; and risk cost allocation.

The Surety Association of Canada (SAC) is a national trade advocacy association that represents the interests of the surety industry across Canada. Our members represent more than 90% of all surety premiums written in Canada and consist of primary surety firms, surety reinsurers, surety/insurance brokers, and other organizations that provide related and services to the surety industry such as legal firms and consultants. We have gathered feedback from students and instructors since the inception of the program and there has been an increased desire from students to complete ACR 101 and ACR 102 at the same time.

ACR 101 Principles of Clinical Research (3 Units)

This introductory course explores the terminology, as well as roles and responsibilities involved in a clinical research project. Good Clinical Practice (GCP) procedures will be examined, as well as an overview of legal considerations of clinical trials. Emphasis will be placed on the foundational skills needed for successful trial management including project management and communication skills.

ACR 102 Research Ethics (3 Units)

Professional guidelines and codes of ethics that apply to the conduct of clinical research will be analyzed. Situations presenting ethical dilemmas including vulnerable populations will be explored as well as scientific integrity, and the responsibilities of the clinical investigation team as defined by GCP guidelines.

If the courses Brand Management and Marketing Financials from the Advanced Marketing Techniques Certificate are approved as electives in the Marketing Diploma, we would also ask for permission to modify the titles of these courses. Course Description(s):

Brand Management (to be changed to Advanced Brand Management)

Anti-requisite: Brand Management

This course is designed to immerse students in the world of business management through the portal of a brand. Brand management is the art and science of creating and maintaining differentiation as a means of sustained long-term competitive advantage for a company. To do this, students will learn how to engage the

operational groups of an organization to deliver on the brand promise from the perspective of a general manager. This course will bring together the disciplines of product development, pricing strategy, customer management, channel strategy, integrated communication, and innovation as the building blocks of a strong brand.

Marketing Financials (to be changed to Measures and Metrics for Marketing Professionals)

The purpose of this course is to bridge the gap in thinking and language between "number-crunching" finance professionals and customer-centric marketers. Seen as an interdisciplinary specialization between Marketing and Finance, this course will train students to understand how marketing actions drive financial performance throughout the organization. Common marketing situations will be assessed including, but not limited to, profit dynamics, product mix management, new product forecasting, breakeven analysis, promotion profitability, distribution, and customer lifetime value assessments. A particular focus will be made on the external environment and the tools a marketer will utilize to maximize financial performance and customer value for the organization.

Branding and Image (to be changed to Introduction to Branding)

This course will explore the development, structure and management of leading brands in our society today. We will discuss the elements of brand identity, brand promotion and management of a strong brand. Learning experiences will incorporate weekly readings, online discussions, assignments and narrated slides.

 - For research, we need a tool that does not complicate the copyright ownership

INTRODUCTION

- 1. This Policy is meant to be read in conjunction with the <u>Research Integrity Policy</u> and the <u>Academic Integrity Policy</u>. This document is not intended to supersede them.
- 2. The Research Integrity Policy sets the expectations for the responsible conduct of research at the University. All those conducting research under the auspices of McMaster University are responsible for familiarizing themselves with the Research Integrity Policy.
- The definitions and the roles and responsibilities as defined in the <u>Research Integrity Policy</u> apply to this Policy. For the purposes of interpreting this Policy, readers are specifically directed to review the definitions of Research, Research Documents, Plagiarism, and Self-Plagiarism, and the roles and responsibilities of Researchers, Supervisors (both Academic and Employment), and Graduate Students.
 - This Policy is intended to provide researchers with a technical solution to check all Research Documents for plagiarism in their work, such as major research papers, thesis documents, scholarly articles, and other research materials as deemed necessary.
- 4. All Research Documents to be seen publicly should normally be checked prior to publication to ensure that they meet the University's standards for research integrity. Furthermore, it is expected that public disclosure will only occur after the Research Documents satisfy the requirements of any intellectual property agreement related to the research.
- 5. The Office of Academic Integrity is the administrative office responsible for assisting instructors, students and staff with issues of academic integrity and research integrity.
- 6. The McMaster Industry Liaison Office (MILO) provides assistance in understanding how intellectual

- 7. The plagiarism checking software provided by the University is an online subscription-based tool that compares a submitted research document to other documents in its database for similarities. The software does not determine plagiarized content but rather highlights similarities with other sources.
- 8. It is the expectation of the University that researchers review any similarities identified by the software with any contributors to the research document, and determine whether changes are necessary before public release.
- 9. The selected plagiarism checking software used under this Policy will not archive a copy of the submitted research document, which is different from some plagiarism checking software, such as Turnitin. The copyright ownership of the research document will not be affected by its submission to the plagiarism checking software provided by the University.

PROCEDURES

10. Each Faculty shall clearly publicize this Policy in their program handbooks and central websites, noting any additional and/ or stricter requirements that may be in place within that Faculty.



Submitting a Research Document (excluding theses)

- 11. It is recommended that the submitter be listed as the corresponding author of the research document though any author who identifies the University as their affiliation in that document may check using the plagiarism checking system with the permission of the other authors.
- 12. It is recommended that the submitter notify the other authors, preferably early in the preparation of the document, that the University has a policy urging plagiarism checking prior to being sent to the journal or society or other scholarly body accepting the document for public disclosure.
- 13. It is the responsibility of the submitting researcher to review the report by the plagiarism checking system.
- 14. Reports showing a low similarity score are likely attributed to the software detecting unintended matching content and can normally be corrected before public release. Instances of high similarity scores being reported by the plagiarism checking system do not necessarily mean that plagiarism/self-plagiarism have occurred however, the Office of Academic Integrity should be consulted if there are concerns regarding research misconduct.

Submitting a Graduate Thesis

- 15. It is expected that all graduate theses, whether Masters or Doctoral that will ultimately be seen by the public shall be checked for plagiarism in compliance with this Policy.
- 16. Thesis shall be checked before being submitted to MacSphere or before being sent to an external reviewer. Since the plagiarism checking system does not need to maintain an archived copy of the thesis, copyright ownership is not affected by this academic requirement. Rare exemptions may be granted with the approval of a Faculty's Associate Dean of Graduate Studies where an alternative method of plagiarism checking is necessary.
- 17. Normally, the graduate student who owns the thesis shall request access to the plagiarism checking system through the University's subscription. The submission folder created for the student on the plagiarism checking site will allow both the student and Academic Supervisor to see the originality score of the thesis submitted for checking.
- 18. The student may make changes to their thesis and re-submit it a second time to ensure no concerning similarities are found. A student may not repeatedly submit revision after revision of their thesis,
- 19. The Academic Supervisor bears the responsibility of addressing allegations of academic and/or research misconduct with the Office of Academic Integrity should they believe that misconduct (as defined in the policies regarding academic and research integrity) has occurred.
- 20. The Academic Supervisor of the student must see the plagiarism checking similarity report and approve the thesis before the thesis may be given to the examining committee or external reviewers.



Research Plagiarism Checking Policy

- 21. It is recommended that the supervisor retain a copy of the plagiarism checking similarity report should it be needed at a later time; a copy of the report should ideally be retained for at least three years or two years after the date the thesis is finally submitted to MacSphere, whichever is longer. In rare cases, the Departmental Chair or their delegate may approve the thesis based on the plagiarism checking similarity report instead and retain a copy of the report per the time limit mentioned above.
- 22. A thesis may not be sent to the examining committee until it has been checked by the plagiarism checking system. In rare cases where the software is inaccessible (for example, the subscription has expired or the University has exceeded its allocated number of submissions), a Faculty's Associate Dean of Graduate Studies may approve the thesis to be sent to the examining committee when the issue cannot be corrected in a timely manner.
- 23. The student understands and approves by following this action that the Associate Dean will submit the thesis to the plagiarism checking system once it is accessible again. The Principal Supervisor of the graduate student may submit the student's thesis to the plagiarism checking system themselves but only with written permission of the student. At no point in time may a member of the student's supervisory committee, who is not the Principal Supervisor, submit the thesis to the plagiarism checking system.
